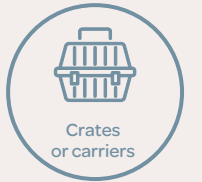
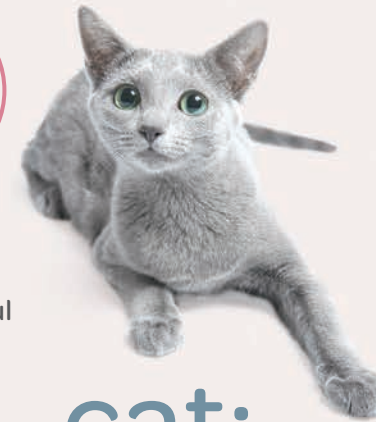
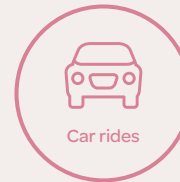

What can cause stress?

Often the environment we live in can cause stress to both cats and dogs, whether that is inside or outside of the home, on a regular basis or during key events.



Spotting the signs

When faced with a stressful situation does your:

dog:

- Pant more than usual
- Dribble more than usual
- Bare their teeth
- Tremble, tuck their tail or hide
- Show repetitive behaviour
- Bite themselves
- Vocalise excessively

cat:

- Run away or hide
- Cower or tremble
- Lie motionless
- Vocalise excessively
- Lick more than usual
- Defecate outside of the litter tray
- Display hostile behaviour
